Service User Advisory Network (SUAN)

St Patrick's Mental Health Services (SPMHS) invites current and former service users to join our Service User Advisory Network (SUAN).

SUAN was established in 2018 to enable SPMHS to engage and consult with as many of our service users as possible. This ensures that the views and perspectives of the people who have experience of our service are included as we implement our current five-year strategic plan, *The Future in Mind 2023 - 2027*.

What does joining SUAN involve?

SUAN members are kept informed about focus groups and consultation forums which they can attend. These groups provide the opportunity for SPMHS to present ideas to the members of the network about changes being considered, and for members to share their ideas and opinions to make sure that the views of our service users are heard and included.

Members will also be invited to join working groups and steering committees to help develop new projects.

Many of our projects will be 'business sensitive' - this means we need to keep information about the project confidential, and you may be asked to sign a confidentiality agreement about a project you are involved with.

Some examples of the projects are:

- An interactive mental health education centre
- · An Advocacy Centre
- An Academic Institute which will play a crucial role in pioneering mental health research
- Modernised inpatient facilities
- Expansion of remote services and SPMHS' Homecare service
- Enhanced inpatient, day care and Dean Clinic service delivery
- Technological innovations and digital mental health solutions.

How do I join?

What happens when I join?

Once you have registered, you will be added to the SUAN mailing list, where you will receive regular updates by email about opportunities to take part in various groups or projects. You will also be kept informed about events and initiatives that may be of interest to you. There is no obligation to take part in the different groups and projects and you can opt out of the network and mailing list at any time.

You can take part in any or all of the following ways:

- · Being a member of a Service User Advisory group for a project
- Taking part in a group discussion or focus group
- · Giving feedback online
- Completing a survey
- · Speaking to someone one-on-one, in person or by phone.

If you have previously used our services as an inpatient or outpatient, attended day programmes or attended the Homecare service, we would we would like your inputs on our different plans and projects. As it's important to focus your energy on recovery when in hospital, you need to have been discharged from inpatient care to take part. If, during your involvement, you need to come back into hospital, we would ask that you take a break to focus on your recovery and rejoin us when you feel able.

I'm a family member, carer or supporter of a service user, can I join SUAN?

We have a Family Member, Carer and Supporters (FCS) Advisory Network which is like SUAN but is made up of family members, carers and supporters of current and former SPMHS service users.
